## Does Adding Azithromycin to Standard Therapy in Patients With Persistent Uncontrolled Asthma Induce Remission vs Placebo?



## STUDY DESIGN

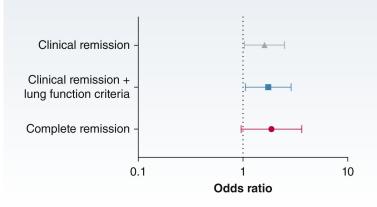
Secondary analysis of **AMAZES** doubleanonymized, placebo-controlled trial: 500 mg azithromycin 3 times per week for 48 weeks vs placebo

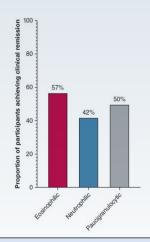
## Clinical remission defined as:

Zero exacerbations or corticosteroid use in previous 6 months and asthma control questionnaire score ≥1

## RESULTS

A higher proportion of patients in the azithromycin arm achieved clinical remission vs placebo (50.6% vs 38.9%; *P* = .032)





Nine patients had to be treated with azithromycin to achieve 1 additional patient with clinical remission

In this study, adults with persistent symptomatic asthma achieved a higher remission rate when treated with azithromycin compared with placebo.
